

Indian arrested for ‘spying’, claim Pak cops

POLICE IN Pakistan’s Punjab province claimed to have arrested an “Indian spy” in the town of Dera Ghazi Khan and have handed him over to a premier intelligence agency for investigation.

On Wednesday, police arrested a man, identified as Raju Lakshman, from Dera Ghazi Khan district, some 400 km from Lahore. Police official Liaquat Leghari told reporters that a team of the border military police arrested the 30-year-old during patrolling.

“Raju Lakshman is an Indian national. The security agencies are interrogating him to know whether he crossed over here inadvertently or for spying purpose,” he said. Dera Ghazi Khan reportedly houses “sensitive installations,” and therefore the Pakistani government has banned the entry of any foreign national in this district.

Leghari said that at this stage, the “motive” of the Indian national’s crossing over here illegally cannot be determined before investigation. Earlier, police said Lakshman was arrested while entering the town from Balochistan province, the same province from where Pakistan claimed it had arrested Indian national Kulbhushan Jadhav.

Jadhav, 49, a retired Indian Navy officer, was sentenced to death by a Pakistani military court on charges of “espionage and terrorism” in April 2017, following which India had moved the International Court of Justice (ICJ), seeking a stay on his death sentence and further remedies. Pak summons India diplomat over ‘ceasefire violations’

Islamabad: Pakistan on Thursday summoned India’s Deputy High Commissioner and condemned the alleged “unprovoked ceasefire violations” by Indian troops along the LoC, saying such actions are a threat to regional peace and may lead to a “strategic miscalculation”.

This was the second time in a week that Gaurav Ahluwalia was summoned by the Foreign Office (FO) for firing along the LoC on July 30.

Director General (South Asia and SAARC) Mohammad Faisal, who is also the foreign ministry spokesperson, “summoned Ahluwalia again and condemned the unprovoked ceasefire violations by the Indian forces on July 30,” the FO said in a statement. PTI

UNNAO RAPE VICTIM INJURED IN ACCIDENT Named in FIR: son-in-law of UP minister, block pramukh, Kuldeep aides

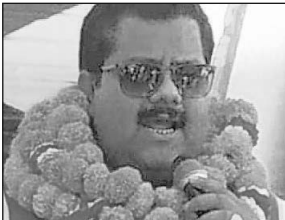
UNNAO’S NAWABGANJ block pramukh Arun Singh, who has been booked in connection with the accident in which the Unnao rape victim was critically injured, is the son-in-law of Uttar Pradesh Minister of State for Agriculture, Agriculture Education and Agriculture Research, Ranvendra Pratap Singh aka Dhunni Singh.

Dhunni (55) is a second-time MLA from Hussainganj constituency in Fatehpur. According to Dhunni’s personal secretary Mohammad Saleem, he won the seat on a BJP ticket in 2007 and then in 2017, after which he was given a ministerial post.

BJP sources said that Dhunni joined the party in 2006. In 2012 he was made its Fatehpur district president. His affidavit for the 2017 Assembly elections shows that he runs a brick kiln and is in the dairy business. He does not have any pending criminal cases against him.

Dhunni’s son-in-law Arun Singh (34) has been named in the FIR registered for murder, attempt to murder, criminal intimidation and criminal conspiracy in connection with Sunday’s accident in Rae Bareilly.

Arun told *The Indian Express* he joined the BJP in 2003 and was later made Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha district vice-president. He was made Nawabganj block pramukh in 2016. He mar-

ried Dhunni’s daughter in 2009 and resides in Nawabganj town.

Denying all the allegations against him, Arun claimed he was booked as part of a political conspiracy by someone who has been misguiding the victim’s family.

“This person, who has his name mentioned in the FIR complaint as an acquaintance, made his wife contest the block pramukh election against me. Since she lost the election, he is using the victim’s family’s grief to take revenge on me. I want justice for the victim’s family and for myself. I want the CBI to do a narco test on me and everything will be clear,” he said, claiming he was on the Amarnath Yatra when the accident took place.

Arun claimed he had no connection with the victim’s family and did not even go to her village. “I did not even know who they were. I came to know about the victim’s uncle (complainant of the FIR) and others after the case was highlighted by the media,” he said.

In addition to MLA Kuldeep

Singh Sengar and Arun Singh, there are eight others named in the FIR. One of them, Manoj Singh Sengar, is the younger brother of Kuldeep. Sources said he was living in Unnao city area and his family residence in the village was locked since the rape case issue hit the headlines.

The FIR also names Vinod Mishra who, according to village sources, is a close aide of Kuldeep, lives in the same village and runs a transport business. Mishra used to manage Kuldeep’s finances.

Husband of Shashi Singh, Haripal Singh has also been named in the FIR. Haripal is the father of gangrape accused Shubham Singh, and was the complainant in the case registered against the victim’s family members for allegedly forging documents to prove that the victim was a minor at the time of the alleged sexual assault by Kuldeep.

The son of Haripal and Shashi, Naveen Singh is another accused. A close aide of Kuldeep and a contractor by profession, Komal Singh is the sixth accused.

While Arun is number seven, Gyanendra Singh, who calls himself the brother of Kuldeep and earlier worked as a journalist in a Hindi news daily, has been named in the FIR. Rinku Singh, a close aide of Kuldeep, and Awadhesh Singh, a lawyer and close associate of Kuldeep, have also been named.

Apart from these 10, 15-20 unidentified people are mentioned in the FIR.

MP Police to tell Zomato customer to sign peace bond

POLICE HAVE started the process to serve a notice to Jabalpur-based Amit Shukla, who had cancelled his food order on Zomato when he learnt it was being delivered by a non-Hindu, that will require him to sign a bond for keeping peace.

“Once the notice (under Section 107/116 of CrPc) is served to sign the bond, the police will watch his activities over six months. The police can take him in custody if there is another violation during the period,” Jabalpur SP Amit Singh told *The Indian Express*.

He added that Shukla’s tweet was against the spirit of the Constitution and had the potential to whip up passions in a communally sensitive town like Jabalpur.

In response to 40-year-old Shukla’s complaint that the delivery person was a Muslim, Zomato, the app-based food delivery service, had tweeted, “Food doesn’t have a religion. It’s a religion.”

This was followed by company CEO Deepinder Goyal’s tweet, “We are proud of the idea of India and the diversity of our esteemed customers and partners. We aren’t sorry to lose any business that comes in the way of our values.” Zomato’s response won the internet.

However, Shukla was unfazed. He said nobody had complained against him and the police had acted on their own. “Let them serve a notice I will respond after taking legal counsel,” he said.

Coffee estate workers remember CCD founder Siddhartha

V G SIDDHARTHA, founder of the Cafe Coffee Day chain who was found dead on the banks of a river near Mangaluru on Wednesday, had set out for Mumbai in early 1980s with Rs 75 lakh he had borrowed from his coffee planter father. By 1985, the youth from Mudigere in Chikkamagaluru district owned more than 10,000 acres of coffee farms in Malnad region. Of this, only 500 acres were his ancestral property.

The workers in his coffee plantations remembered him as a considerate and helpful employer.

Dasappa, who has spent 35 years in the Chethanahalli estate, said, “I have seen Siddhartha since his childhood days. He was humble and treated people with respect. He always supported us.”

Kavitha Bai, who along with her family has been working in the estate for 25 years, said, “My children are studying in good schools thanks to Ayyavaru (Sir). He always emphasised the need for education. He provided jobs to children of his labourers in his companies across the world. If anyone needed financial assistance, he would always lend a helping hand.”

Another estate worker remembered Siddhartha as a generous and kind person who treated his staff like family.

Siddhartha was known for his philanthropic work in Mudigere and had backed many development programmes in the area.

According to an Amalgamated Bean Coffee (ABC) company employee, Chikkamagaluru town does not have a multi-speciality hospital, so Siddhartha had wanted to build one in his father’s name, where all services would be provided free of cost to people from Malnad region.

“He had a very close relationship with coffee and wanted to take Karnataka coffee to global markets. He succeeded in doing so,” said Halappa Gowda, who has known the family for long.

Siddhartha’s family has been running coffee plantations for more than 140 years in Malnad region. He was the only son of Gangaiah Hegde, a freedom fighter, and Vasanthi.

Senior Congress leader B L Shankar attributed his close friend’s success to his “own ability and determination to build such a huge business”. Shankar, who is from the same village as Siddhartha, added: “He took Karnataka coffee to the international level and gave employment to many. Still, he remained a very humble person...”

Delhi High Court tribunal upholds 5-yr ban on SIMI

A TRIBUNAL of the Delhi High Court has upheld the ban imposed on the Students Islamic Movement of India (SIMI) and validated a Central government notification, issued in February this year, extending the ban for another five years.

The Indian government describes SIMI as a terrorist organisation and had banned it in 2001, shortly after the September 11, 2001 attacks, for two years. The ban was since extended from time to time. The five-year ban was first imposed in 2014.

The ban was lifted in August 2008 by a special tribunal, but was reinstated by the Supreme Court on August 6, 2008 on national security grounds.

The tribunal, headed by Justice Mukta Gupta, on July 29 had dismissed SIMI’s contention that the government had no fresh evidence against it to extend the ban for another five years and held that there were valid reasons to ratify the ban imposed by the government under the Unlawful

Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Pinky Anand and advocates Sachin Dutta, Rajesh Ranjan and Balendu Shekhar appeared for the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), which had on February 21 issued a notification setting up a tribunal under the Act, after the five-year ban ended on January 31. The judgment has been sent in a sealed cover to the MHA.

Earlier, the tribunal, constituted under the UAPA, had issued notices to SIMI and its functionaries, asking them to explain why the organisation and its activities should not be declared unlawful. Under the law, the tribunal has to decide if there was sufficient cause to declare an organisation unlawful. The tribunal conducted its hearings in several cities across India, including Delhi, Pune and Chennai, and took on record the testimonies of various police officers and others to adjudicate the issue.

The Centre had said its decision was needed to bring the Muslim community into the mainstream by checking its “disgruntled” elements.

Vadodara: A leopardess was electrocuted on Thursday in a village near the west division of Gir Wildlife Sanctuary, a forest department official said. The wild cat, aged about 9 to 12 years, died after coming in contact with an electric wire at a farm in Jagatiya village, D T Vasavada, Chief Conservator of Forests at Junagadh, said. The leopardess was found hanging from the high-voltage wire in farm. PTI
